Bylaw 1. REGISTRATION OF MEMBERSHIP

a. ORDINARY MEMBERS

Persons who are eligible to become Ordinary Members are those who meet the requirements of the Constitution (6.1). This also draws attention to:

- the procedures to be adopted in the application and approval process (6.2, 6.3);
- the criteria for membership (6.4);
- the conditions and obligations of membership including the paying of any fee or subscription as determined by the Board (6.5); and
- the procedures to be adopted in the event of cancellation or suspension of membership(6.6)

Additionally, a **Register of Members** must be maintained and updated regularly (6.7). The circumstances and procedures to be adopted on cessation of membership are described in the Constitution (7.1).

Ordinary members are required to pay a Joining Fee of \$10.00 (similar to purchase of a share in a company-for-profit). They may also be required to pay an annual subscription, if the Board so decides. In the event of the Wind-up of the Foundation, ordinary members may have financial liability that shall not exceed \$100 (5.1).

b. LIFE MEMBERS

Life Membership is within the gift of the Board. Members who are eligible to become Life Members include those who have given **significant service** to the William Fletcher Trust and/or Foundation. Life members have the same entitlements and obligations as Ordinary members, including voting rights and financial liability, for life unless they resign. Life members would not be required to pay any further annual subscriptions if such were introduced.

c. HONORARY MEMBERS

Honorary Membership is within the gift of the Board. This privilege may awarded to persons who are deemed to have given **strong support** to the William Fletcher Trust and/or the Foundation. Honorary Members have no financial liability. They may be invited to General Meetings and may comment but may not vote. They may receive the Annual Report of the Foundation.

d. REGISTER OF MEMBERS

All the above categories of members (a, b, and c) are to be included in the Register of Members, each with a unique membership number to be retained for posterity.

e. FRIENDS

The Foundation may also keep a separate list (un-numbered) of interested non-Member Friends. Friends are interested persons who do not qualify for inclusion in the categories of membership above and thus have neither voting rights nor financial liability. They may be invited to exhibitions and social functions.
